Word of God Sunday

"He opened their minds to understand the Scripture" (Luke 24:45).

Pope Francis in 2019 established the *Sunday of the Word of God*. "The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the "Word of God". As you know, we are in the midst of the year of "Parish Eucharistic Revival," which even adds importance to this Sunday's invitation for us to pay greater attention to our needs to understand and practice the Word.

What is the Word of God?

We often identify the Bible as the Word of God. This is not wrong, but God speaks to our hearts in many different ways. For instance, he speaks to us in prayer and through our conscience, and often through other people. Hence, the Word of God covers much more than a printed book. Nevertheless, the Bible is the privileged collection of communications between God and his people. These stories and poems have nourished the lives



of the people of Israel and the Christian Church right through the centuries, and they continue to nourish us today. They tell the story of God's love and our salvation from ancient times onwards. The scriptural texts offer us both challenge and encouragement for our lives, and are especially valuable to us through the hope they offer us at dark moments.

Celebrating the Sunday of the Word of God

In Aperuit illis (§3), Pope Francis suggests the following ways to celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God:

- Enthrone the sacred text.
- Highlight the proclamation of the Word of the Lord.
- Emphasize the honour due to the word of God in the homily.
- Celebrate the Rite of Installation of Lectors or a commissioning of Readers.
- Provide training for Readers.
- Give a Bible, or one of its books, to everyone.
- Encourage people to read and pray with Scripture daily, especially through the practice of *lectio divina*.

May the Word of God we hear and we speak increase our joy and hope and brighten all we encounter!

GOD'S CALL by Fr. John Cuff

One of the more memorable figures of the 20th century was Princess Diana. She set out on a course to becoming queen of England but ended up becoming an internationally known queen of hearts instead. In the disillusionment that followed upon her loss of the royal title, one might imagine her hearing the call of God, "Follow me, and I will make you queen of hearts," because, once abandoning the rat-race of royalty and high society, she seemed to hear a call of service to suffering and forgotten humanity, which took her to places she'd never have dreamt of going, to mine fields and AIDS hospitals. Some would say that in doing so, within her short life, she won the hearts of the whole world.

In today's Gospel we see two brothers and would-be apostles Simon and Andrew, called to make a radical decision about the rest of their lives. They are fishermen, busy with their trade, casting nets, but we don't hear that they're catching many fish. Probably on that particular day, they too, like Diana, are going through a state of depression and near-despair. It's in this state of mind they hear the word of God addressed to them: "Follow me and I will make you fishers of men." They leave their nets at once and follow Jesus. Who knew that in time, through them and the other apostles, their message would reach the ends of the earth. Another who received a call from God was Jonah in today's first reading, who was called to warn Ninevah of God's wrath. For a pious Jew like Jonah, Ninevah, a former conqueror of Israel, was a godforsaken city on the highway to hell, without the slightest hope of regaining God's favor. No wonder Jonah balked at being sent there; the mission to Ninevah was an exercise in futility! The big surprise was that, no sooner had "godforsaken" Ninevah heard the word of God, they repented and regained God's mercy and forgiveness.

There are times in our lives when God invites us to follow Him more closely and to participate in His mission. No matter what path we have chosen to follow, a fisherman can grow into a fisher of souls, a princess into a queen of hearts, and a disgruntled prophet can preach to a people he abhors, all of them moving from being self-seeking to working for the glory of God for the benefit of humankind. Even today God seeks men and women to send on mission to impossible situations like Nineveh. Where is our Nineveh today? God invites us to bring the Good News to unimaginable places and "impossible" situations. The good news is that these "hopeless" cases are not so hopeless after all, for if even Nineveh could turn back to God, so can they.



Weddings: Weddings need to be scheduled at least six months in advance. Couples are reminded to secure the Church date before the reception hall.





RESPECT LIFE

Living the Gospel of Life – God, the Father of all nations, has blessed the American people with a tremendous reservoir of goodness. U.S. economic success since last century has reshaped the world.
