Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In his message for the Fifth World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis observes that the COVID-19 crisis, "continues to affect millions of people and, even when it does not bring suffering and death, it is nonetheless a portent of poverty." Yet, he continues, "poverty is not the result of fate; it is the result of selfishness. It is critical, therefore, to generate *development processes* in which the abilities of all are valued, so that complementarity of skills and diversity of roles can lead to a common resource of mutual participation."

For the past 50 years since the inception of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD), organizations funded by CCHD lead the call for all of us to stand in solidarity with those who have been marginalized in their communities and to act against injustice. For example, the main purpose of the Coalition for Spiritual and Public Leadership (CSPL), whose membership includes parishes, institutions and communities, is to address injustice in the vision of the Gospel. In its promotion of economic justice, CSPL builds and incubates worker-owned cooperatives. One such co-op involves the worker-owners of Living La Fiesta, who shifted during the Coronavirus pandemic from preparing food to making masks for the public.



SCHOOL NEWS



Our Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten students participate in the Early Childhood Language Intensive Program at St. Therese Chinese Catholic School, which builds upon the rigorous Chinese program already in place at these levels. Previously, students received 30 minutes of Mandarin instruction per day. Through the Language Intensive Program, students will receive an extra 20 minutes of Mandarin per week. These 20 additional minutes will be taught at a time separate from their usual daily Mandarin class, and will cover topics that reach beyond the Mandarin vocabulary they are learning in their regular Mandarin classes. These subjects will include Chinese culture and history, math, science, and social studies. By learning Mandarin through other subjects, students will both increase vocabulary and conversational skills while expanding their understanding of Chinese culture and history, math, science, and social studies.

The joint youth ministry team of OSM and SMTCP brought witness to life at the first YM gathering in nearly two years. Adult team



members shared personal testimonies at the close of the evening.

Brother Charles, the youngest member of our team and the one wearing the white monastic habit in the picture, shared the way he prays as a member of the Norbertines. "I wake up and go to bed singing the Psalms with my community. It's a super fun way to live. I look forward to getting to know some of you. Let me know if any of you have questions about "the mysteries" of religious life. I would be happy to share."

Next month, our team will flip the script. Youth will make Christmas cards in their ancestor's native language for the shut-ins. Food will also be collected for the Vincent de Paul Society. Youth today, our team understands, prefer witnessing their faith not through speeches but rather through acts of charity. Hopefully, this strategy will bear fruit during Advent.

Years ago, our parish might have opted for 'scripted' vocation talks, inviting women and men religious to speak at our youth in a classroom setting. CHRIST THE KING by Fr. John Cuff

On this final Sunday of Year B, we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. Most liturgical feasts look back at events in the life of Christ, of Mary, or of the Saints, but today's feast looks forward to an event that has not yet taken place. We're still anticipating that long-awaited day when our Lord and King will come again in glory. And until that great day comes, we pray every day, with hearts full of hope, "Thy Kingdom come!" and find our joy in the Lord's promise that it *will* come.

Meanwhile we do not yet see the Father's plan completely fulfilled. We follow in the footsteps of a King who did not cling to glory. He came as a helpless child, a humble carpenter, a crucified criminal. The only procession ever held in his honor was on Palm Sunday, when he rode a lowly donkey. The only crown he ever wore was a crown of thorns. Jesus our King remains present in our world, but disguised, without splendor or glory. He is hidden in the Eucharist, in the poor, the sick, in prisoners. He is also present yet hidden in our family members and neighbors, and in our own hearts.

In today's Gospel, Pilate confronts Jesus on the question of his being called "king of the Jews." Jesus does not deny the title. He reveals that he is indeed a king, but not according to Pilate's way of thinking, for his kingdom "is not of this world." This is the reason why Pilate, who is absorbed in the affairs of this world, does not recognize Jesus' kingship. Moreover, since Pilate is not a Jew, he thinks he can wash his hands of any concern about Jesus and his claim to be a king.

Here Pilate shows us how easily we Catholics, also absorbed in the things of this world, can exclude ourselves from the Kingdom of God. We don't have to commit any monstrous crime or make a pact with the devil. To be traitors to our King, all we Catholics have to do is to decide that Jesus is not important to us, that we've other matters to attend to, so that we will not miss being out of favor with the world. But in their encounter Jesus gives Pilate an opportunity to transcend his narrow perspective by inviting him to commit himself to the truth. "The reason I was born, the reason I came into the world, is to testify to the truth. Anyone who is committed to the truth hears my voice."

We who honor Jesus Christ as our King, are therefore called to be witnesses firmly committed to the truth. We cannot claim to be a Christian while at the same time harboring lies. We firmly place ourselves in submission to Jesus who is the Truth. This means accepting the whole truth about ourselves, our past, our imperfections, our sins, and the whole truth about the Lord's law of love, so that he may reign over our lives. On today's Feast of Christ the King, we too like Pilate encounter Christ, and we should examine ourselves if we accept Christ's kingship in our own lives; or do we like Pilate submit to the pressures, the distractions, the attachments of this world, so that Jesus is not that important to us. Christ is our King to the extent that we allow him to be.


