Peter's Pence

hen Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022, a humanitarian crisis began for Ukrainians, whose lives were shattered by the violence of war. Many left their homes in eastern cities in Ukraine for cities in the west, such as Lviv, farther from the most intense fighting. From the beginning of the war, the Holy Father pleaded for an end to the violence and expressed his love and concern for the Ukrainian people who were its victims. In solidarity with the victims of war, the papal almoner, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, made two visits to Ukraine in March 2022. He first visited the cities of Rivne and Zhovka and other regions directly affected by the early conflict. He returned to Ukraine to celebrate Mass in the cathedral in Lviv and to deliver an ambulance donated by the Holy Father to the Center for Mother and Child Health to assist children displaced by the war

The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war. migrants and refugees, and the poor affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. THE MISSIONARY and THE MECHANIC by Fr. Cuff

Some years ago, an American missionary took a group of students on a field trip to Kenya. Their van took them deep into the rugged hinterland. On one of their travels the vehicle broke down and they had to hire the local village mechanic. The mechanic saw the problem, travelled to the city to buy spare parts, and spent two whole days repairing it. The clergyman, who told this story on himself, was worried that the bill would be too high. So to force the mechanic to settle for less, he went into the washroom, removed most of the money from his wallet and hid it in his socks, so that when the mechanic would tell him the cost, he'd open his wallet and say, "Sorry, this is all I have!" So coming out of the washroom as everyone is loading up to leave, he asks the mechanic, "So now, what do you charge for your services?" The mechanic looks at him and says, "You are a man of God. I do it for God. God will pay me. For you it is free of charge." The clergyman ends his story by observing that the mechanic, by his trusting faith in God, had obviously overcome the fear of poverty and attachment to money, which he, the missionary, in his relative affluence, had been unable to do.

Today's Gospel is the conclusion of Christ's "missionary discourse" to his disciples; it speaks of both the demands and rewards of discipleship. First, the attitude that we missionaries should have: Loving Christ above all, even our family; carrying our cross; losing our life for Christ's sake; these are the demands of a missionary. Secondly, the rewards of discipleship: "Whoever welcomes you welcomes Me; and whoever shows hospitality to you shows it to Me." The missionary in the story apparently had shown his love for Christ above all, even his own family, by leaving his native land to go on mission to Africa. But he also experienced the rewards of discipleship when he encountered the selfless hospitality of that village mechanic. Indeed most of today's Gospel is about how we give and receive hospitality from others. Similar to that unselfish mechanic, the pagan lady in the first reading recognized Elisha as a holy man, a man of God, so she treated him with respect and showed him hospitality, even though he was a stranger. As a result she was rewarded by God in giving birth to a son. Indeed, she "did not lose her reward." So how do we treat the stranger, the poor, the homeless, the friendless, and the many immigrants coming to Chicago these days? Also we should note how ready we are to receive hospitality from them in return, since as Catholics our mission is to go out to others, to be God's ambassadors, as were the Apostles and the prophet Elisha.


