The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

will be celebrated on this weekend during all masses.



Why is this Sacrament so important?

Christ is our physician and He healed many during His earthly life and makes his disciples to share in his ministry of compassion and healing: "So they went out and preached that men should repent. And they cast

out many demons and anointed with oil many that were sick and healed them (#1506, Catechism *of the Catholic Church*).

Illness is part of human condition. Our human family has suffered physically, emotionally, and spiritually during the global pandemic. We need God's healing power.

Who Receives this Sacrament?

The Anointing of the Sick "is not a Sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time from him to receive this Sacrament has certainly arrived (#1514, CCC).

If a sick person who received this anointing recovers his health, he can in the case of another grave illness receive this Sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced (#1515, CCC).

What Can You Help with?

If you are able to, please bring other members who are homebound and may need assistance to Church so they can be anointed. If you know any parishioners who are in need of Anointing, but can't physically make it to church, please call our parish offices to arrange for a visit by our priests.

Asylum seekers — men, women and children — are arriving in Chicago. Will you welcome the stranger? We are the body of Christ alive in this world. The stranger is hungering and thirsting — Christ is presenting himself to us in their need. We are called to respond with faith and love.

Thousands of people are fleeing violence, political oppression, and overwhelming poverty in Central and South American countries. Since early September, parishes, priests, religious sisters and brothers, church ministries, and Catholic Charities have shown an outpouring of concern for these travelers.

These brothers and sisters in need have revealed to us the fragility, strength, and sacredness of our shared humanity. In turn, they are experiencing the love of Christ through the compassion of volunteers and employees.

Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in Chicago by mid-October, and **a coordinated Catholic response is underway** so we can maximize our collective impact. We are providing pastoral care and considering options such as transitional shelter and parishfamily sponsorship opportunities.

ZACCHAEUS'S CONVERSION by Fr. John Cuff

A young family went to a nice restaurant for dinner. One of the kids found a bright shiny dime, put it into his mouth, and started to choke on it. His frantic parents started calling for anyone to help their choking son. A man at a nearby table came over, turned the boy upside down, slapped him on the back a few times, and out came the dime. The grateful parents asked the man, "Are you a doctor or something?" "No," he said, "I work for the IRS."

In today's Gospel we meet another tax-man, Zacchaeus. As chief tax collector of Jericho, Zacchaeus had to be quite rich by those days' standards. The Romans would levy a certain amount of money on each city and hire a tax-collector and his enforcers to go round and collect taxes from his fellow Jews. Any money collected over and above what he paid to the Romans was his profit. As a result, though Zacchaeus made a lot of money, he was hated, not only because he overtaxed the people, but also because he helped the pagan Romans exploit his own people. He was regarded as a public sinner, a traitor, and as someone unclean before God. Thus, although financially well to do, Zacchaeus lived a life of loneliness, alienated from his own people and from God.

That's why Zacchaeus was determined to see Jesus. But how could he let himself be seen in the crowd with the same people he had milked year after year to amass his wealth? He thought of a way to see Jesus without anybody seeing him; he climbed a tree and hid up there. But when the crowd spotted him, imagine the shame and embarrassment he must have felt. People jeered at him, but the jeering stopped when Jesus saw him up there in the tree and said: "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today." Later at dinner with him, Jesus did not preach to him that he must repent or go to hell. Rather His non-judgmental and unconditional acceptance of the sinful Zacchaeus spoke to him more eloquently than the best sermon ever could. Finally, Zacchaeus shocked everyone when he announced: "Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor; and if I've defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." Which meant that Zacchaeus' wealth would be all but gone. But who needs wealth when you've found a meaningful life?

There are many Zacchaeuses hiding in the trees under which we pass everyday. Jesus challenges us to look up and invite them to a meal. We must take the first step to reach out to them because many of them have been so intimidated by religious enthusiasts that they have resigned themselves to their fate. When we invite them with unconditional and nonjudgmental love to share a meal or have a drink with us, we might be surprised to see that we are spreading the Good News of God's love in a way that touches their hearts more than any amount of preaching could ever do.




