Blessing Prayer for Nurses

THE APOSTLES' NEEDLESS FEAR by Fr. Cuff

Five-year old Jimmy is in the kitchen as his mom prepares dinner. She asks him to go to the basement and fetch her a can of tomato soup. "It's dark in there and I'm scared," replies Jimmy. Mom tries to convince him that it's safe to go alone to the basement but without much success. Finally she says "It's OK, Jimmy, Jesus will be in there with you." Jimmy walks hesitantly to the door and slowly opens it. He peeps inside, sees that it's still dark in there, and starts to go back. Then he gets an idea. He opens the basement door a little and yells: "Jesus, if you're down there, would you hand me up a can of tomato soup, please?"

Jimmy's fear is like that of the disciples. As the time draws near for Jesus to leave them, they're afraid to face the world alone. In today's Gospel reading, Jesus does pretty much what Jimmy's mother tried to do, namely, convince them that there is no need to be afraid, even when they'll not see Him. "Do not let your hearts be troubled," He says. He asks them to master their fears, and the reason he gives is both simple and profound: "You believe in God, believe also in me." It is easy to believe in God, a spiritual being that we cannot see. The challenge is to believe that God is present in ordinary, flesh-and-blood human beings whom we know all too well, ordinary human beings who are often lacking in knowledge, in love, and in moral strength. To believe in God is the easy part; to believe, not only in Himself, but also in our frail fellow human beings is the hard part. In other words, the disciples see God in Jesus. So long as He's around, there's no fear. But they don't see God in their all-too-human fellow disciples. The disciples put Jesus on a different level from themselves. But Jesus is trying to convince them that if God could work through Him, Jesus, then God could as well work through any other human being. Thus God can use them and work through them also, in spite of their human deficiencies: "I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father."

God's always with us, so we shouldn't let our hearts be troubled. We believe in God, so let us now also believe in each other, men and women of faith, through whom He continues to work.


Please contact parish office for any of the following: Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.
