Never Alone



Today's readings: Gospel at the procession Mark 11:1–10 or John 12:12–16; Isaiah 50:4–7; Psalm 22:8–9, 17–18, 19–20, 23–24; Philippians 2:6–11; Mark 14:1–15:47. Today's readings leave us much to ponder. During the Gospel at the procession, a crowd welcomes Jesus to Jerusalem, singing, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" At the end of the Gospel from Mark, Jesus was not hailed but reviled as passersby taunted, "You who would destroy the temple in three days, save yourself by coming down from the cross."

In the last verses from Mark's Gospel, we witness the faith of the steadfast disciples, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of younger James and Joses, and Salome. These women had followed Jesus in Galilee, stood by until his death, and watched where he was laid in a tomb. Apparent, too, is the faith of Joseph of Arimathea, who wrapped Jesus in linen and laid him in the tomb.

Also obvious in the Gospel is the wavering faith of those who had followed Jesus for three years. Not only did Judas betray Jesus, but Peter could not stay awake with him as he prayed in the garden, and later Peter denied him three times. The Gospel proclaimed today does not record the apostles' presence at the crucifixion.

During Holy Week, Christians have the opportunity to be with Christ as his last days are recalled. Take to heart Jesus' words to the apostles in Gethsemane: "Remain here and keep watch."

THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, March 25 A Precious Offering

In today's Gospel we see how Mary, Lazarus' sister, takes what may have been her most precious possession and used it to anoint Jesus' feet. We are also given opportunities to give the very best of ourselves. Today, examine whether you have gifts within you that you hold back. Who would benefit from those gifts? *Today's readings: Isaiah 42:1–7; Psalm 27:1, 2, 3, 13–14; John 12:1–11.*

Tuesday, March 26 Judas Is Humanity

Imagine how Jesus would have felt knowing that Judas was about to betray him. He surely was troubled but also hurt. Let us also imagine what may have been in the mind and heart of Judas. In Judas we can see all of humanity reflected: the emptiness of greed and envy, the alienation and loneliness of sin. However much we strive to be like Jesus, we will always meet our flaws and shortcomings. In Christ, however, we are strengthened to do good in the world despite our failings. As we approach the celebration of the resurrection and prepare for the renewal of our baptismal promises, resolve to let the new life that Christ gives to well up within you. *Today's readings: Isaiah 49:1–6; Psalm 7:1–2, 3–4a, 5ab–6ab, 15, 17; John 13:21–33, 36–38.*

Wednesday, March 27 Second Chances

Much can be learned from Judas' betrayal. Perhaps by examining Judas' actions, we can right our failings. Consider how you can explore and acknowledge what keeps you from God. This week reflect on the times you preferred a path other than God's. How did following another way disturb your relationship with God and others? Trust in God's promise of forgiveness for all who truly repent. *Today's readings: Isaiah 50:4–9a; Psalm 69:8–10; 21–22, 31, 33–34; Matthew*

Thursday, March 28 Serving Others

Tonight, with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Sacred Paschal Triduum begins. Humbling himself, Jesus washed and dried the feet of the disciples. Just as he washed their feet, by his resurrection, he washed away our sins. Perhaps you have an elderly parent, neighbor, or relative with impaired movement. How can you humble yourself and be of service to another? Mass of the Lord's Supper: Exodus 12:1–8, 11–14; Psalm 116:12–13, 15–16bc, 17–18; 1 Corinthians 11:23–26; John 13:1–15.

Friday, March 29 Symbol of Love

During the Adoration of the Holy Cross in today's liturgy, the faithful are invited to process to the cross and offer a sign of reverence. Even when you are unable to attend this service, spend time in quiet contemplating Jesus' surrender of himself on the cross. How are you asked to surrender yourself to the crosses in your life? *Celebration of the Passion of the Lord: Isaiah* 52:13—53:12; *Psalm* 31:2, 6, 12–13, 15–16, 17, 25; *Hebrews* 4:14–16, 5:7–9; *John* 18:1—19:42.

Saturday, March 30 Beacon of Light in the Darkness

Jesus has died and descended into hell but the darkness surrounding us is only temporary. The light of the world will shine brightly once more, and soon enough it will defeat the darkness. *Today's readings: Genesis 1:1—2:2; Psalm 104:1–2, 5–6, 10, 12, 13–14, 24, 35 or Psalm 33:4–5, 6–7, 12–13, 20–22; Genesis 22:1–18; Psalm 16:5, 8, 9–10, 11; Exodus 14:15—15:1; Exodus 15:1–2, 3–4, 5–6, 17–18; Isaiah 54:5–14; Psalm 30:2, 4, 5–6, 11–12, 13; Isaiah 55:1–11; Isaiah 12:2–3, 4, 5–6; Baruch 3:9–15, 32—4:4; Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 11; Ezra 36:16–17a, 18–28; Psalm 42:3, 5; 43:3, 4 or Isaiah 12:2–3, 4bcd, 5–6 or Psalm 51:12–13, 14–15, 18–19; Romans 6:3–11; Psalm 118:1–2, 16–17, 22–23; Mark 16:1–7.*

THE MESSIANIC SECRET REVEALED By Fr. John Cuff

Each Palm Sunday, whether the Passion in Matthew, Mark or Luke is read; if we read the shortened version, the Gospel always ends with the Centurion's act of faith. Here's how Mark describes it: "Then Jesus, uttering a loud cry, breathed his last; and the Centurion who stood guard over him, on seeing the manner of his death, declared, 'Truly this man was the Son of God!" (Mk 15:39) This act of faith by the Centurion, found in all three synoptic Gospels, is more striking when we remember a certain theological insight called the "messianic secret." This "messianic secret" refers to the fact that Jesus often orders those who recognize him as the Messiah not to tell others. For example, the leper in Galilee (Mk 1:43), the unclean spirits (Mk 3: 11), those who witnessed Jesus raise the daughter of Jairus from the dead (Mk 5:43), the deaf mute (Mk 7:36), and later the blind man (Mk 8:26), are all told to "tell nobody." Even after Peter's confession of faith, "He warned them to tell no one" (Mk 8:30), and finally at the Transfiguration, again Jesus strictly charges them not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah "until the Son of Man has risen from the dead" (Mk 9:9). In other words, throughout his public life, Jesus ordered people who recognized him as the Messiah, to keep it a secret and to tell no one; and this is what's called the "messianic

Why does Jesus want to keep his identity as Messiah a secret? Because if people knew he was the promised Messiah, they'd consider him a king come to accomplish his mission through power and conquest, rather than through suffering and death, and thus he tried to keep his messianic identity a secret. For this reason, the confession of the Centurion, a Gentile and a foreigner, at the very moment of Jesus' death---"Truly this man was the Son of God!" is one of the most important statements of the passion narratives. The Centurion's act of faith is a paradox, a mystery; because that which moves him to faith was not a miracle, not a healing, not an exorcism, not a dazzling light. Rather, "it was because of seeing the manner of his death," that he declared, 'Truly this man was the Son of God." What convinced him was the way Jesus suffered and died on the cross, forgiving his executioners and "uttering a loud cry" of total abandonment and trust in his Father: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit" (Luke 23:46).

Today as we enter into Holy Week and meditate on His passion and death, we're reminded that the cross of Christ, "a scandal to the Jews, an absurdity to the Gentiles," has become for us who believe the very revelation of God. Because like the Centurion we clearly see that, even more than his miracles, even more than his teachings, it is "the manner of his death" that awakens our faith. Through his total self-surrender to his Father we see the greatness of his love, and it is through his willing acceptance of suffering and death that Jesus reveals who he is: the Messiah, our Lord and Savior
