EVANGELIZING LORI: PRAYER

I have a new roommate at the nursing home named Lori. On the first day she moved in, I asked her how often she prayed. She replied, "Not often. Only when I need something." She said she wasn't religious and hardly knew anything about her Lutheran faith. In my heart, I prayed, "God, do you have a word for her? Is there something you want me to say to her?" No response from God. God speaks to us at the perfect time, not always when we want Him to. The next day, right after Lori and I had both received our lunches, I suddenly heard God tell me to pray the "Prayer Before Meals" with Lori. My initial response was, "I don't want to," but I've matured enough by now and made enough mistakes in my spiritual life to know not to say "No" or "I don't want to" to God. I've learned by now not to question what the Holy Spirit tells me to



do or ask "Why?" I mean, I **did** ask God the day before what He wanted me to say to Lori, and now that He has answered me, I need to just do it! So without any more hesitation, I asked Lori if she would like to pray with me before we eat. She said yes, but asked me to lead. After I said the prayer, she responded with a loud and confident "Amen!" Ever since then, we've been praying together before every meal—three meals a day—and she would always add "And thank you for the people who cooked it for us!" before we both said, "Amen!"

That was more than 6 months ago and to this day, we still do the "Prayer Before Meals" together, but now, we've asked our neighbor Joseph across from us to join us, and the three of us pray together before eating. When the CNA hears us saying the prayer, she would say "Amen!" in unison with us. When Lori's dad Mike comes to visit at lunchtime once a week, I would exclaim joyfully, "Let's pray!" and together we would pray.

I often encouraged Lori to talk to God like a close friend—sharing with Him her inmost thoughts, feelings, how her day was going, and asking Him for help every time she needed it. Sometimes when there are things going on in Lori's life, I would add to our meal prayer, "Please help everything to go well at Lori's appointment today" or "Please take away Lori's pain" or "We pray for Lori's dad to feel better." This way, I could show her intercessory prayer and other reasons to pray.

God taught me that the way to grow Lori's prayer life is through small steps, starting with something easy and short, like praying before meals every day. Our relationship with God grows when our prayer life grows. The goal is to pray always—remaining in constant conversation with God as we go about our day.

Do We Like Complaining?

We are already in the fifth week of Lent. How are we doing with our Lenten penance and preparation? Are there any virtues that you are working on? Pope Francis writes that Lent is a time to sow the seed of goodness, a time to stop gossip and to reap a harvest of salvation for others and ourselves.

On my Lenten meditation this week, I came across a beautiful story below about St. Francis on stop complaining, which can burden our joyful sprits.

One of the legends associated with St. Francis tells of a vineyard near a church in the Rieti valley. Francis was staying there while being treated for eye problems. So many people came to visit him that the vineyard was trampled. The priest complained that he would not get the small yield of grapes on which he relied for his household wine each year. Francis assured him that he would harvest at least twenty loads of grapes that year instead of the usual thirteen.

What's more interesting than the miracle that Francis promised (and which did in fact occur) is what Francis said to the priest: "Cease despairing. Don't trouble anyone any more with your complaints. Have confidence in the Lord and in my words."

Hope this story can help us to be more reflective on our own life and our trust in the Lord. May your Lenten journey be fruitful!

OBEDIENT FAITH VS. EXPECTANT FAITH by Fr. Cuff

Of all Jesus' miracles, surely, the raising of Lazarus, a rotting corpse four days dead, is the most astonishing. When Martha objects to the opening of the tomb and says, "Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days," she has given up all hope. No one in the story, not even Mary or Martha, imagined in their wildest dreams that Jesus could bring their brother Lazarus back to life after being four days dead. So expectant faith that's often found in Christ's other miracle stories is not found here; but rather a different kind of faith, the faith of obedience.

To work the miracle, Jesus issues three commands and all of them are obeyed to the letter. That's how miracles often happen even today, through faith that obeys. Firstly, He says, "'Roll away the stone.' So they rolled away the stone." Did they understand why in the world they had to do this heavy work of moving the stone to expose a stinking corpse? No way. Rather it was their faith in Jesus showing itself not through understanding but through obedience. Why didn't He command the stone to roll back by itself? Perhaps, as C.S.. Lewis said, "God seems to do nothing of Himself which He can possibly delegate to His creatures." In other words God doesn't do by a miracle what we can do by obedience; He asks our co-operation. His second command is directed to the dead man: "'Lazarus, come out!' and the dead man came out," and it's followed by immediate obedience. As Lazarus stumbles his way out of the tomb with hands and feet tied, his face wrapped in bandages, he must have been a frightful sight as he burst forth! Jesus' third command is addressed to the people, "Unbind him and let him go." There's no way Lazarus can unbind himself; he needs the community to do that for him. By unbinding him and setting him free from the death bands, they accept him back as one of them.

Today many of us Christians have also fallen victim to the death of sin. Many are already in the tomb of hopelessness and decay, in bondage to sinful habits and attitudes. Only a miracle can bring us back to life in God. Jesus wants to work this miracle for us this Lent. He calls out to each one of us: "Come out! Come out from the darkness of sin!" And to the Church, "Unbind him!" Are we ready to obey? To cooperate with him for the miracle? To roll away the stone that stands between ourselves and Christ? To leave our sinful lives behind and take the first step to come out of the place of death? Let us obey His call and come alive this Lent, alive to Christ!

Lenten Regulations (from Feb. 22nd, 2023, Ash Wednesday--- the Paschal Triduum)

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

A few simple Lenten Prayers (Hallow)

- "God, may Your light guide my day, and your spirit bring me peace. Amen."
- "God, may my sacrifice of today of (state your Lenten sacrifice) remind me of my dependence on You for all the blessings I enjoy. Amen."
- "May I stand in solidarity today with all my brothers and sisters around the world who are suffering. May we be united in your love, and may I work to build your kingdom here on earth." Amen
