#### MURPHY'S GREAT SURPRISE by Fr. John Cuff

In today's Gospel, the 72 disciples are sent out to proclaim the Good News that the Kingdom of God is near. Here's a story told of what that Kingdom may look like:

Old Mr. Murphy loved his native land Ireland. He worked and toiled on its land when he was young. He poured his sweat into its rich soil. He raised his sons and daughters on its fertile ground. When the invader came, he fought for its freedom. When too old to till the soil, he used the time to travel its length and breadth to enjoy its treasures. Murphy loved Ireland so much that when it came time to die, he had his sons carry him outside so that he could lay next to the ground. There he grabbed a handful of earth to hold onto. And that's the way he died, and that's the way they buried him, still clutching that precious clump of soil to his heart.

When he got to heaven's gate, God came out to meet him. God told him he was a good man and welcomed him into heaven. Oh, but one thing. God said that he couldn't bring that dirt into heaven. But Murphy couldn't let go of it, he loved Ireland so much. So, God left Murphy standing at heaven's gate and went back inside.

Years passed and God came out again, this time appearing as one of Murphy's drinking buddies. They chatted and joked as they recalled the good old times. Then God invited Murphy to come on in now to heaven, but to let go of that dirt he was still holding onto. But Murphy couldn't, he loved Ireland so much. So again, God had to leave him there standing at heaven's gate.

After a few more years, God appeared as Murphy's granddaughter; she came out of heaven's gate and told him how much everyone missed him and begged him to come inside. By this time Murphy's joints had stiffened and his hands could no longer clutch the precious handful of earth he was trying to take with him. The soil fell from his hands and God brought old Murphy inside. Once inside he couldn't believe it; there before his eyes was his beloved Ireland and much more besides.

Sometimes people can be so enamored of the little bits and pieces of God's creation that they have a hold

on in this life, that they can't believe there could be anything better. But if we open ourselves in faith to whatever God asks of us, open ourselves to the glory that Christ promises to those disciples who follow him, we'll already begin to know God's Kingdom. Then we will understand Jesus' parables of a treasure buried in a field or a pearl of great price. Then we will encounter what "Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it entered into the heart of man, the good things God has prepared for those who love Him." The Kingdom is something we cannot see now, but it is near to those who are living their faith. It is joy beyond imagining. This is the Good News of the Gospel; this is the message of Jesus in a nutshell, and the proclamation of the 72: "The Kingdom of God is at hand."

#### **FOLLOW JESUS by Sister Caritas**

When each of us makes a decision to follow a certain path, or make a special choice, we often end up also choosing to leave a lot behind. We cannot make our new choice and destiny without also having to. We cannot go north and south at the same time. These are opposite directions. We can go in the same directions at the same time. We must let one choice behind. In our Gospel today, someone wanted to follow Jesus and also say "good bye to his father at the same time. Another wanted to follow Jesus and still have a comfortable place to reside. Both things, Jesus said, were not possible and compatible with each other. Sacrifice was inherent in following Jesus. Today this is still true. If we want to completely follow Jesus, we have to let some things go.

In each of our lives we are challenged to follow Jesus. To do so, we must give up sinful ways. To completely follow Jesus, we must walk in His way. Can you do this? Can "We" do this? In "His Ways," we are called to make those kinds of letting go choices. Each of us must look at all the parts of our life. Anything that does not fit the pattern of Jesus life, must go. The sacrifice must be made. Are you "up to the results of your choice?" Jesus says, "Come follow me." Loving Jesus completely calls us to give ourselves without reserve. We can do this with God's grace and help. It requires an entire YES to Jesus.
