# THE FOUR KINDS OF SOIL by Fr. John Cuff

Once during a retreat being given to a group of religious - all priests, brothers and sisters -- the participants were asked, "Of the four kinds of soil in today's Gospel passage, which do you think mostly describes yourself; what kind of soil are you?" One of the nuns, reflecting on the passage, announced that, well, being a religious, she obviously was not the first kind, that is, the lington Heights, IL. Dr. Geetha and Tom Chitta, "pathway soil," which the seed could not even penetrate, the founders of FCN are very happy to visit us for in fact she had heard and answered a call to follow a vocation. And, she said, she surely wasn't the shallow or "rocky soil," where the seed had no roots and soon withered, for in fact she'd already spent half of life in the con-check-ups and medicine to thousands of needy vent; no, she obviously was not the "rocky soil." And of course, she couldn't possibly be the "thorny soil," where God's word gets choked to death by worldly cares, for she had given up possessions to take a vow of poverty and had kept it faithfully. All of which meant that she was probably the "good soil." Indeed, other retreatants had similar reasoning and came to the same conclusion about themselves.

They were all surprised when the retreat master proceeded to give his own interpretation of the parable: The impenetrable "pathway soil," he said, is a no-brainer. This type of soil of course are the Pharisees and Leaders of the Jews who hardened their hearts against Christ, stopping their ears lest they hear and understand. The shallow or "rocky soil," that is, those who enthusiastically embrace God's word at first, without thinking through the demands of the Gospel for their lives because their faith was weak, are of course the Apostles. The "thorny soil," those who hear and understand, but are unable to live out their faith because they're choked by worldly concerns and material possessions, of course refers to the rich young man whose possessions prevented him following Christ. But the good soil are those who, as the first reading says, "drink in" God's word, put into practice what they hear and thus produce much fruit, indeed You can pray the novena from July 17-25 in preparaa hundredfold. In other words, the "good soil" are those saints who, like Paul, Augustine, Mary Magdalene, Francis Assisi, Ignatius Loyola, just to name a few, underwent a deep conversion and radical change in their lives, and went on to bear great fruit for the Kingdom, thirtyfold, sixty-fold, a hundred-fold.

The main point of the parable then is that the success of the Word of God ultimately depends upon the heart into which it is sown, whether we accept it, under-considerations.—USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activistand it, and then act upon it, as did those great saints who accomplished so much for the Kingdom. God's Word can likewise accomplish its work in us; the only requirement is that we have the right disposition of mind and heart. So, what kind of soil are you?
