

THE CANAANITE WOMAN'S PERSEVERENCE By Fr. John Cuff

Mahatma Gandhi in his autobiography tells how, during his student days, he read the Gospels and saw in the teachings of Jesus the answer to the major problem facing the people of India, the caste system. Seriously considering embracing the Christian faith, Gandhi attended church one Sunday morning intending to talk to the minister about the idea. On entering the church, however, the usher refused to give him a seat and told him to go and worship with his own people. Gandhi left the church and never returned. "If Christians have caste differences also," he said, "I might as well remain a Hindu."

The belief that God's blessings are meant for some peoples or cultures has been around for centuries; such a belief was quite prevalent in Jewish society in which Jesus grew up; he may have been guilty of a certain religious bias himself. When Jesus said in today's Gospel reading, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel," he may have been reflecting a certain popular bias. It's not clear whether he really believed it himself or whether he said it just in order to expose and correct its false claims. Every people and culture has a handful of such prejudices and myths from the myth of the Jews as the only people of God to the exclusion of all others, to the prejudice of the caste system in India. Indeed, it took the perseverance of a Canaanite woman to create an awareness among early Jewish Christians that their belief in the exclusive divine prerogatives of the Jewish people did not stand up to reason. It's probable that you and I owe the fact that we are Christians today to the heroism of this unnamed woman who helped dismantle the dividing wall of intolerance between Jews and Gentiles. Given her status as a foreigner and as a woman, it took phenomenal courage on her part to decide to take on the all-Jewish and all-male company of Jesus and his disciples in today's Gospel. Even though she addresses Jesus by his proper Messianic title: "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David," Jesus still ignores her: "He did not answer her at all." Most people would have given up at this point, but this Canaanite woman instead intensified her efforts. And her courage and her refusal to take no for an answer finally pays off. When Jesus says, "It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs," she doesn't lose her cool but keeps her eyes on the goal of her mission, which was to show that even non-Jews are entitled to God's blessings in Christ. Finally, it is Jesus who gives in: "Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish," and the woman gets what she wanted. Jesus' gradual appreciation that faith may have been given to gentiles beyond Jewish borders is also suggested when he elsewhere says, concerning the Roman centurion, "Amen I say to you, I have not found so great a faith in Israel." So let's not be afraid to challenge prejudice and falsity even in high places, even in religious high places. The least among us can be a vehicle that God can use to bring justice and healing to all of God's disadvantaged daughters and sons all over the world.


