The Holy Father will celebrate the Synod's opening in the Vatican this weekend, October 9-10, 2021. And Cardinal Cupich will celebrate a special mass at Holy Name Cathedral for the 5:30 pm Mass on Sunday, October 24, 2021, to formally pray for the success of the Synod.

Through this synod, Pope Francis wants to hear from the faithful all over the world about ten facets of our Church's life. After the opening ceremony, in the next six months, our Archdiocese and the dioceses throughout the World will find ways to listen to the faithful and then a summary of the findings will be shared with the Holy See. ENTERING THE KINGDOM by Sister Caritas

When I was teaching First Grade, sometimes I would ask the class, "Who wants to go to heaven?" Most of the hands would go up. Many people would respond positively to this question. Jesus says, "You know the commandments." The young man says he has kept them since he was young. Jesus offers him a further challenge. "Go sell what you have and give to the poor. Then come and follow me."

Jesus continues the discussion. His disciples looked at riches as a blessing from God, a sign of God's favor. Jesus is teaching the disciples and us, that clinging to wealth can be a problem in getting to heaven. If we remember and carry this wisdom given to us by Jesus, we can do and attempt what seems impossible. With God, His grace and help, nothing is impossible.

THREE RICH YOUNG MEN- Fr. John Cuff

Today's Mass readings mention two rich young men, both seeking to become even richer in God's sight, and both faced with the choice between wealth and wisdom. The one in the Gospel, (who could have become Christ's 13th Apostle), chose wealth instead. The one in the second reading (young King Solomon) chose wisdom. This dichotomy between wealth and wisdom recalls the story of yet another third young man, this time a fictional character, faced with a similar choice. The story goes like this:

> A wise and holy hermit finds a precious stone beside the brook. He brings it with him to his little cottage. One of his disciples sees the precious stone and begins to covet it. The hermit notices the young disciple is looking dismal and miserable day by day. "What is it?" he asks the young man.

"It is the stone," the disciple replies. "I want to have it. I will never have peace and happiness until it is mine."

The good master smiles and remarks serenely, "But of course you can have it. Here, take it." The disciple takes the stone. The next morning, he is back.

"What is it?" the hermit asks.

The disciple holds up the precious stone and says, "I want the wisdom that made you renounce this precious stone so unselfishly."

Jesus clearly tells us that one of the greatest barriers to entering the Kingdom of God are earthly riches. The disciples, thoroughly confused, react with astonishment, because Jesus had just turned the accepted Jewish standards of success completely upside down, namely, that one's prosperity was a sign of reward from God, indicating that God was pleased by this particular individual. In a similar way, we, who like the Apostles who came away from Jesus' encounter with the young man in today's Gospel understandably shocked at His words about the dangers of wealth, and who ourselves live a rather comfortable first-world existence, we too might well ask: "Then who can be saved?"

Jesus agreed with His disciples: Yes, for weak, sinful human beings, the demands of the Kingdom are impossible high. But the good news is: what's impossible for us is possible for God. No rich man could ever renounce all his wealth or use it with Christian detachment, unless God gives him the grace and the wisdom to do so. With God's help the married can live in fidelity, the worldly-minded can become simple, the rich can surrender all claim to their possessions, and the young can give their lives to Christ. For salvation comes from the grace of God. We still have to obey God's commandments, as Jesus told the rich young man, but even to do that we need the grace and wisdom of God.
