Building the New Reality #12: RCIA - by Tom Howard

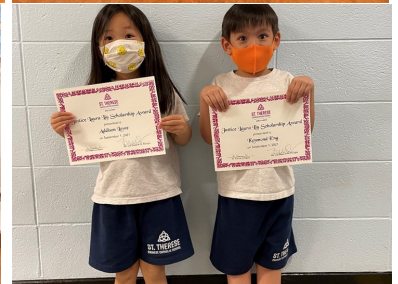
THE MIND OF GOD - Sr. Caritas

About nine months later I woke up without any pain after over twenty years of constant pain. When I was well, I came to St. Therese. ST. JAMES ON FAITH & WORKS (1) - Fr. John Cuff

Catholics believe the Bible contains no contradictions when teaching a truth essential to salvation. But today's second reading seems to contain an apparent contradiction regarding such a truth, one so central to Christian faith that it caused a major split in the Church and continues to divide us.

One reason for Protestantism's split from Catholicism was Martin Luther's interpretation of Romans 3:28 which reads, "For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law." Luther understood this to mean that we're saved by "faith alone." He was so convinced of the importance of this viewpoint that he included the word "alone" in his translation of Romans 3:28, even though it's not in the original Greek text. In today's second reading James tells us that faith, by itself, if it has no works, is dead. So how to reconcile this apparent contradiction between Paul's teaching that we are justified by faith apart from good works, and that of James that faith without works is dead?

To reconcile this tension, we need to ask ourselves three key questions. (1) What is justification? (2) What are these works spoken of? (3) What does the Bible as a whole teach on the subject of faith?

First, what's justification? It's the act of God in which sinners who confess their faith in Jesus Christ are declared innocent, as if they'd never sinned. Justification is a free gift of God's grace, based entirely on the merits of our Lord Jesus Christ. It happens at the moment one submits in faith to Jesus Christ. In the early Church, this change of heart (repentance and believing the Gospel) was marked by the penitent receiving baptism and the gift of the Holy Spirit. At his first proclamation on Pentecost Peter announced to the crowds, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ, that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:38). But justification is not salvation. Whereas justification happens at the beginning of the Christian life, salvation happens at the end of it, when the believer is finally admitted into God's eternal presence. So for us baptized Christians, justification is already in the past, but salvation is yet in the future. This is the consistent picture we get from the letters of Paul, who always speaks of salvation as a future event.

One problem Luther had, and many Christians today still have, is that of confusing justification with salvation. Separating the two events, we see that God who justified us by faith alone does not save us by faith alone. A justified person must bear fruit of good works, befitting repentance, or risk damnation on judgment day. As St. Paul urged the Philippians, "Work out your salvation with fear and trembling." So the next time someone accosts you with, "Are you saved?" say, "No, not yet, but I'm working on it." Even St. Paul acknowledged that his own salvation was not a sure thing, but a work in progress.
