BARTIMAEUS' FAITH by Fr. John Cuff

There's an old African fable about how Duck learnt to swim. Duck and Hen lived together by the seaside. Their food was the rotten fish that the fishermen threw away. Every day they saw Heron swimming up and down the sea, catching and eating fresh fish. Duck longed to do the same, but Hen said to Duck, "Why desire what you can't have? The Heron is a sea-bird. His body is light. We're land-birds and land-birds don't swim. If you enter the sea with this your heavy body, you'll sink like a stone and that'll be the end of you." Duck believed Hen. And so they went on eating their rotten fish.

One very hot day, Duck could eat nothing at all since the rotten fish smelled so bad. She just sat by herself, sadly looking at the sea. Soon Heron swam by and saw Duck in such a pitiable condition. He asked what the matter was and Duck told him everything: how she always longed to swim and eat fresh fish, but alas, the Creator had made her a heavy land-bird. It was then Heron explained to Duck that at some time in the past, even he himself was not a swimmer, but was forced by hunger to jump into the sea, and then he discovered he could swim. Heron invited Duck to try it but Duck was afraid; but with his encouragement she overcame her fears and stepped into the sea. To her surprise she saw she was not sinking; she was floating! In time Duck learnt to swim well and catch all the fresh fish she wanted.

You see, Duck was equally a land-bird and a sea-bird. But as long as she believed she was only a land-bird, she remained on land and suffered want and privation. So the story's really about how Duck came to discover and realize her God-given identity and potential as a swimmer. Similarly, the story of Bartimaeus in today's Gospel is about how a miserable nobody begging by the road-side came to realize his God-given dignity as a human being and child of God. What Jesus did for him was not simply restore his sight, but more importantly, reward his faith. We might liken it to what Heron did for Duck, enlightening and empowering her to realize her God-given potential and dignity.

Like Duck by the seaside or like Bartimaeus by the wayside, do we at times feel like we're born to be swimmers and yet here we are idly sitting and eating rotten fish by the shore? Do we sometimes feel, like Bartimaeus, that we should be following Jesus and yet find ourselves all day long doing nothing but the same boring routine of trying to find food? The good news is that Jesus is passing by. He can heal and take away whatever holds us down. Don't listen to friends who, like Hen, will say that you are daydreaming. Bartimaeus didn't heed those trying to dissuade him. Jesus is here to heal the blindness that has immobilized us, to empower and transform us from being passive bystanders to becoming his active and enthusiastic followers in the journey of life.

No doubt, as you live and get older, the questions linger, and may even be some of your questions from a much younger time. Questions, questions. My favorite question used to be Why? I thought that if I knew why, I could more easily understand how, what, where and when. A friend once diverted my focus on why by suggesting there really may be a more helpful quest such as what?

Did you know that the Holy Fathers, the Popes, have many questions, as they try to guide and lead the worldwide Catholic Church?

Pope John Paul II had a question. How does the Catholic Church relate to the world in our times? More than twenty-five years ago, he called the Second Vatican Council together, inviting bishops to come together from all over the world to de-

They come together in Rome year 2023 to discuss with each other, consult, and share with the Pope what they have learned. You, and all the members, on all levels of our parish, are part of the Synod. Are you prepared to answer guestions? Are you prepared to ask questions of each other, the future, our children, of priests, bishops, even the Cardinal? How do we become a Synodal Church? How do we become a Church that talks and shares with each other? How do we become, on every level a Church that shares, discusses, asks important questions? How do we grow? Stay tuned for more.
