#### O'NEILL'S PRICELESS PRIZE- Fr. John Cuff

Today's somewhat shocking Gospel reading recalls an interesting legend that has to do with the origin of Ireland. The legend says that in ancient times, a new island was discovered to the west of England. It was still uninhabited; so one day, a great band of adventurers set off from the European mainland in a fleet of boats, to conquer and settle the newly discovered island called Ireland. The leader of the expedition proclaimed that whoever touched the land first would possess the entire territory and become the first king of Ireland.

One of the band of explorers was named O'Neill, and he was determined to have the new land for himself and his family. During the race to the new island, O'Neill rowed his boat mightily. At first he was in the lead, but then another boat caught up with him and began to pass him. He realized that he could not win the race to land, so what did he do? As the boats neared the shore, O'Neill dropped his oars, took a battle-axe, and hacked off his own left hand; then with a mighty heave, he took his hand and threw it on the shore so that he would be the first to touch the land. In this way O'Neill became the first king and possessor of Ireland.

Whether the legend is true or not, it brings to mind Christ's striking words in today's Gospel: "If your hand or foot cause you to sin, cut it off; or if your eye causes you to sin, tear it out; it is better to enter life maimed than to go to hell." What does he mean? He means that we must avoid sin at all costs, to be willing to sacrifice everything, even to do something as drastic as cutting off a hand, in order to possess the Kingdom of Heaven. But Jesus does not mean we should that we literally must cut off our limbs or pluck out or eyes---indeed, self-mutilation is a grave sin--rather he uses this shocking way of speaking figuratively to emphasize that nothing is more important than our eternal salvation. Just as the land of Ireland was worth a hand to O'Neill, so the eternal land of heaven is also worth any sacrifice to obtain it.

In today's Gospel, Christ reminds us that there is another land to which we belong, another "right of abode" that we must strive to attain, membership in the Kingdom of Heaven. After all, our true home is not to be found on this earth; indeed, life is a journey to our true homeland in heaven. But to arrive there we have to pay a price. We must be willing to make sacrifices to pay that price; as Christ taught, "The Kingdom of Heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls who, when he found the one that he liked, sold all to purchase that pearl." Or again, it's "like the man who found a treasure in a field and sold all he had to buy that field." Like the single-minded O'Neill, the first king of Ireland, we must be willing to sacrifice all to gain the prize of our eternal reward.
