Building the New Reality #10: 'A TRIBUTE TO FLORENCE YU' - by Tom Howard

Florence Yu's (Flo) final wish for us was delivered by her daughter Jennifer this past Saturday during the eulogy at her mass of the resurrection. "Flo desired that each of you go out and do something you enjoy." As you can well imagine, the way I chose to pay tribute to Flo was a long bike ride. Spiritual fruits stemming from this bike ride follow below.

Most were still in bed at the crack of dawn when Flo and I set out on our journey from Chicago's Little Village neighborhood. Our destination was Niles, IL.

Initially, to my great surprise, the intersections were unusually tame. This, coupled with a biking cadence perfectly aligned with the sequence of all the city stoplights, put me in a flow, allowing me to travel an astonishing 11 miles, through densely populated city streets, without making one complete stop. At the outset of this tribute journey, I couldn't help but wonder, "Could an uninterrupted bike ride be Flo's way of providing me with a foretaste of heaven?"

At least from a first glance, Heaven seems to me to be a place of total freedom, without any restrictions, laws, or ordinances. Time and space, in this divine place, places no limits on one's capacity to love. St. Therese of Lisieux once described her role in Heaven through this beatific lens: "When I get to Heaven, I will shower the earth with rose petals."

Soon the street asphalt heated up, exposing nasty pot-holes. Businesses opened up, cars took to the road, and pedestrians began carefully standing at most crosswalks. The return trip, unlike the first leg, was characterized by constant interruptions.

LISTEN, OBSERVE, ACT AND FOLLOW - Sr. Caritas

When you listen to TV or radio, you will hear directives in between programs, giving information about living today with the Covid pandemic. These directives come from scientific knowledge which has been developed from leading scientists. They are given to the communities to prevent the spread and increased illness spread by covid, now Covid 19. "Wear your masks, wash your hands, stay five or six feet apart and, make sure you get vaccinated." Governments and health care officials try to keep people from getting sick and having to be hospitalized.

In the first reading today, Moses is telling the Israelites, the directives which are strong and life giving from God. "Hear, observe, that you may live. Take possession of the land which the Lord is giving you." "You will give evidence of your wisdom and intelligence to nations since your God is so close to your nation unlike other nations." God, Father of the "Great nation," is speaking to the people with strong



During this transition, from uninterrupted to interruption, Flo invited me to remember the poor and forgotten. The disabled, the vulnerable, those pushed to the margins of society due to lack of opportunity and resources, the physically and mentally challenged: These folks either do not have access or might not be capable of riding a slick road bike for a joyride. Interruption dictates their lives. Life teaches the poor to wait and stand in line with grace. I tend to lose it. My progress-pushing, uninterrupted, idealized image for Heaven needed refinement.

Could the constant grind of interruptions in life, health struggles, job loss, and financial challenges help a faithful individual taste and see the goodness of the Lord? Christ makes breakthroughs in my life when I am most vulnerable and broken. When I need healing, I get anxious and lose hope. Christ can bring me peace during periods of uncertainty and despair. True freedom, my journey taught me, is encountered on a cross, not a bike. Jesus Christ suffers with us. Our Lord does not reside above the fray but squarely within it.

Thank you for the blessing, Flo. Would you please continue to pray for our community at SMTCP?

words, active words. It is also filled with clear directives, a call to us too.

Today's Gospel tells of the objection of the Scribes and Pharisees from Jerusalem, challenge Jesus since some of His disciples are eating without washing their hands. Thus, they are not observing the handwashing ritual of the Jews. The observance is looked at as more sacred than keeping the commandments of God. God says, "These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." As we listen to these directives of different times, we are encouraged to make choices which will make us people of wisdom, people who want to be close to God with our whole hearts, minds, will and strength. Whose directives will you follow, and how will you follow? Will you follow those which lead you to God, life, faithful observance, and lives of holiness and healthy spiritual lives? Following and so acting is up to you.

ST. JAMES ON TRUE RELIGION - Fr. John Cuff

In the coming four Sunday Masses, the Church will read from St. James' Epistle in which he offers several keen practical insights on what true religion is and what it is not. Here's a story to illustrate:

A man and a lady order fish dinners at a takeout restaurant. The girl at the counter mistakenly gives them a bag of money, the entire day's proceeds, instead of the fish. The couple drive to their favorite picnic site to enjoy their dinner, but instead find the money, almost \$1000. They drive back and return the cash to the grateful manager, who profusely praises the man's honesty and calls him a hero and even a saint. He suggests putting an article and their photo in the local newspaper to thank them for their honesty, but the man vigorously declines. "But why on earth not?" the manager pleads. The man leans over and whispers in his ear, "You see, this woman I'm with isn't my wife; she's somebody else's."

Yes, an honest hero maybe, but he's no saint. As St. James tells us in today's second reading, true Christian holiness has as much to do with keeping ourselves pure as doing good to others. "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world." The man in the story scored high on honesty but low on purity.

Most Christians fall into one of two camps. Either they score high in their commitment to social justice and fairness but low in self-mastery, or score high in self-mastery but low in their commitment to justice and fairness. James, the Apostle of practical Christianity, teaches we need both to be truly holy and acceptable before God. He teaches the importance of faith in action, and he defines for us what true devotion is. He shows that there are two practical ways of doing the word of God. One is reaching out to my neighbor in need and the other is in disciplining myself and keeping myself pure. The litmus test of true devotion is whether and how we live out the word of God that we hear.

In the same chapter James also uses the analogy of a man who looks in the mirror and sees his dirty face and disheveled hair and goes away without doing anything about it. The word of God, like a mirror, shows us how dirty our faces are and how disheveled our hair is. A wise man would immediately wash his face and shave his beard to improve his looks. That's the purpose of the mirror. In other words, just hearing the word of God alone doesn't make us holy; that happens only when we put into action what God's word teaches. "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves." What James is saying is that to listen to and not practice the gospel message is to misunderstand religion completely. Question: Are we truly religious in the eyes of God?

Please contact parish office for any of the following:

Baptisms: Parents must be registered practicing parishioner and attend a baptismal preparation session before a baptism will be scheduled.

Communion Calls: Please contact the Rectory when someone who is homebound or in the hospital wishes a visit to receive Holy Communion or the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The Anointing of the Sick is for anyone seriously sick and not only for those near death.

Confessions: Saturdays, 4:15-4:45 p.m. at St. Barbara Church or by appointment.

Ministry of Care: Eucharistic Ministers are available to visit, pray with, and bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and unable to attend Mass.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith.

Weddings: Weddings need to be scheduled at least six months in advance. Couples are reminded to secure the Church date before the reception hall.



Novena to St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta

Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta, you allowed the thirsting love of Jesus on the Cross to become a living flame within you, and so became the light of His love to all.
