



WHAT GOD HAS JOINED TOGETHER- Fr. John Cuff

The Pharisees who "tested" Jesus by asking if it was lawful for a man to divorce his wife already knew the answer. They never really had any doubts about the dissolubility of marriage. Mosaic Law allowed divorce and remarriage: "If a man takes a wife, and after they are married she is unpleasing to him because of something objectionable in her, let him give her a statement in writing and send her away from his house. And when she has gone away from him, she may become another man's wife."

Their only disagreement was the meaning of this "something objectionable" that a husband would find in his wife to justify divorce. The conservative school of Rabbi Shammai said it meant only a case of scandal, like adultery. The liberal school of Rabbi Hillel said it meant any case of annoyance, "even if she has burned his supper." The even more liberal school of Rabbi Aqiba said the woman didn't have to be guilty of anything; that the man simply no longer fancied her was reason enough for divorce. So the question was a trap, since if Jesus favored one school of thought, he would alienate the others.

In reply Jesus went above Mosaic law to God's plan of creation, saying that from the beginning, God (in the book of Genesis) had ordained husband and wife to live in unity: "What God has joined together, let no one separate." So Jesus here was not interested in laying down legal regulations but moral principles. On the question of divorce, He said that God intended for husband and wife never to separate, period. With this ideal in mind, He implied that Moses' provision that a man may divorce his wife by giving her a letter of divorce was not permission to divorce, but rather Moses' way of making allowance for people's "hardness of heart," implying that Moses knew the divine ideal for husband and wife but still didn't enforce it, due the stubbornness of his people. In fact, the provision to divorce her with a letter was not to facilitate separation of husband and wife, but to protect the unity of marriage. The "triple express" divorce, current among their Semitic neighbors, whereby a husband could orally repudiate his wife by simply saying three times in the presence of witnesses "I divorce you," might even be done in a fit of anger. But the stipulation requiring a letter of divorce could delay matters for months. This gave the husband time to sleep on it (like Joseph, who had originally decided to divorce Mary), and friends and family to mediate, probably saving many marriages from a hasty divorce.

Thus the Pharisees focused on the law and overlooked the ideal. So do we. A thorn in the side in our own times still is frequent divorce and remarriage due to "hardness of hearts." Let us pray the Holy Spirit enlighten us to present the ideals of the Gospel, in ways that will be seen as practical and realistic to people of today.


