Students are back in class. From the perspective of faith formation, the reestablishment of group work is long overdue. Health restrictions rendered face-to-face interaction to the sidelines for a year and one-half. Young people struggled to find ways to work and play in groups.



Social and emotional needs, once again, are addressed daily at school. Masses (school, campus, family, and feast day masses), pilgrimages, service projects, and field trips all represent creative ways to help our young people belong to a community.

Speaking of building community, the picture of youth cleaning the church highlighted in Fr. Li's column indicates that things are looking up.

Our worship site is clean and shiny for today's feast day celebration. Little ways, like church cleaning, are St. Therese of Lisieux's way. The more our young people witness their love for God, the more inspiration.

Eight months after the second hip replacement, one January morning, she got up with no pain. It was like a miracle. Their attitude about life changed from struggle to freedom. Joy replaced dread and life became a gift again. God had answered years of effort and prayer.

Hello from the Music Ministry This Saturday, the 4th of September is Sr. Janis Haustein's last Mass. She is returning to her convent, The School Sisters of Notre Dame. The convent is located in Mankato, Minnesota. Sister first came to us on October 15th,2000 for the Pipes Spectacular concert that was held throughout the whole United States. This was part of the Library of Congress Centennial Celebration, Honoring French Composer, Olivier Messiaen.(1908-1992). Sr. Janis was one of the performers for the program, "Music for Organ and Brass" here at St. Barbara church.

One of the many positions that Sr. Janis held while living in Chicago was Professor of Music Theory and Music History at the American School of Music in Chicago. Sr. also taught organ at the Conservatory. (Including me)

After that post, she became the morning organist at Holy Name Cathedral for 10 years and then along with her position there she became our substitute Saturday organist for 8 years plus. Not to forget the countless students she taught on piano and organ.

ST. JAMES ON FAVORITISM - Fr. John Cuff

Once there was a little old man. His eyes blinked and his hands trembled; when he ate he clattered the silverware, often missed his mouth with the spoon, and dribbled a bit of his food on the tablecloth. Now he lived with his married son, having nowhere else to live, while his son's wife disapproved of the arrangement. One day, when the old man again spilled his tea, she said, "I can't have this," and so she and her husband took him gently but firmly by the arm and led him to the corner of the kitchen. There they set him on a stool and gave him his food in an earthenware bowl. From then on he always ate in the corner, blinking at the table with wistful eyes. Then one day his hands trembled more than usual, and the bowl fell and broke. "If you are a pig," said the daughter-inlaw, "you must eat out of a trough." So they made him a little wooden trough and he got his meals in that.

These people had a four-year-old son of whom they were very fond. One evening the young man noticed his son playing intently with some bits of wood and asked what he was doing. "I'm making a trough," he said, smiling up for approval, "to feed you and momma when I get big." The man and his wife looked at each other for a moment, not saying anything. Then they went to the corner, took the old man by the arm and led him back to the table. They sat him in a comfortable chair and gave him food on a plate, and from that time nobody ever scolded when he clattered or spilled or broke things.

This is one of Grimm's fairy tales. It brings out the evil of overlooking the fact that every human being regardless of age, health, or wealth, needs to be treated with dignity and respect. Today's second reading from James condemns favoritism. In a word, favoritism (or partiality) means to allow oneself to be unduly influenced by a person's social status, prestige, power, or wealth, or the lack of these things. It usually takes two forms: looking up to the rich and powerful, or looking down on the weak and vulnerable. In Grimm's tale it is the case of looking down on the weak and vulnerable little old man.

James' rhetorical question, addressed to Christian communities of his day, where the rich were being favored over the poor: "My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favoritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ?" (James 2:1), teaches us that favoritism is inconsistent with Christian faith. One cannot claim to be a believer in our Lord and still be a respecter of persons by showing partiality. And why? Because Jesus himself was not a respecter of persons, as even his enemies readily admitted. God's children must shun all favoritism, "for God shows no partiality" (Romans 2:11). May God open our eyes to see Him and serve Him in others, especially in the poor, the weak, and the vulnerable.


