Both worship sites are now blessed with “installed locations” for two different statues of St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta. St. Rocco returned to his original location and the Garden of Gethsemane has a new location. These aesthetic worship site shifts offer us the opportunity to consider our own thirsts and hunger. Perhaps the Eucharistic gospel readings these past few weeks invited you to reflect on these questions already.

Adequately situating Mother Teresa’s image, the patroness of our parish, you can well imagine, required not only a great deal of prayer, consultation, planning, and rearranging but also delicate pastoral sensitivity. Older images in our worship sites hold both great historical and deep cultural patrimony. Personal emotions are attached to each image. Thank you for your patience and understanding as these changes were implemented.

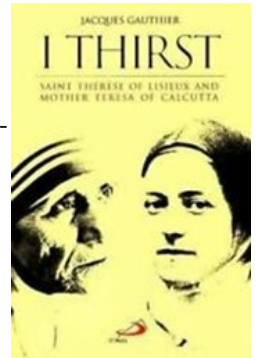
Last week this article argued that the exit sign is something missionary disciples should pay more attention to. Jesus requires all apostles to be active, making practical differences in the lives of others. Listening to the Word of God and receiving the Eucharist each week should impel each of us to strive to make the world a safer, cleaner, more just, and healthier place for all God’s people to live.

Two words, “**I THIRST**” vividly accompany the crucifix and the new image of St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta at the shrine in our SMT worship site. I attempt to contextualize this phrase for us as BNR begins in earnest.

Both SMTC and St. Therese of Lisieux spent a great deal of time meditating and reflecting on one of Jesus’ final statements while dying in agony on the cross. The reason why they both became canonized saints is simple: Both bore fruit to the phrase “I Thirst” through a consistent witness of love for Jesus via acts of unconditional charity.

How might we, like the Missionaries of Charity, satiate the thirst of Christ in Chinatown and Bridgeport? They accomplish this by serving the poor through health care, education, and other acts of charity. Thanks to this charitable witness, this living testimony of satiating the thirst of Christ, millions of disenfranchised people across the globe now know of God’s mercy and Jesus’ love.

Fr. Tom McQuaid, now retired but still helping out here at our parish every so often, proposed in his sermon that aforementioned human tragedies could be eliminated if we had less fear. **BNR** will present you with a multitude of ways to move beyond fear. The ministry heads look forward to reaching out to each of you with practical invitations to get involved. The future of our faith community depends upon it.



THE MYSTERY OF FAITH- Sr. Caritas

Human nature is both very interesting, powerful, and strange. We admire, follow, and pay immense attention to certain people and events. Individuals and groups will make great sacrifices, pay anything, or go anywhere just to see a movie star, TV personality or famous, record setting athlete. The Pope comes to Chicago, and everyone fills the whole Grant Park area to be at his Mass or be in his presence.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus deals with the murmuring Jews who think they know everything about Jesus and the scriptures. Jesus tells them that those who “listen to the Father and believe come to Jesus.” Their ancestors ate bread in the desert and died. The Jews objected to Jesus saying that He was the bread “that came down from heaven.” They cannot believe in Jesus and do not seem to “Know the Father.”

Jesus continues His teaching on the lifegiving bread that He is. “I am the bread of life.” “I am the living bread that came down from heaven: whoever eats this bread will

live forever. The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.” Whenever we go to Mass and receive Holy Communion, we receive the body and blood of Jesus. By believing in this mystery of faith and by receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus, the Holy Eucharist, we participate in this amazing gift of being one with Jesus. We are united with Him. We eat this bread which will give us everlasting life. Deeply believing in this mystery, we believe it is the food that nourishes us and brings us to the eternal life of heaven. All we must do, is attend Mass. Jesus is present. The Son of God is present there and we can receive Him. Do you really believe this? If Jesus is important to you and you believe what He says, what keeps you from coming to Church? What keeps you from receiving Him? What is more important? Come. See. Participate. Receive Jesus and be one with Him, with The Father and with each other.

Mask Policy Update from the Archdiocese:

The rise in the number of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations attributable to the highly transmissible delta variant understandably has caused a shift in the guidance of public health authorities.

Cook and Lake Counties and the City of Chicago have reached the threshold for "Substantial Transmission" of the virus. Therefore, the Counties' and Chicago's Departments of Public Health, consistent with IDPH and the CDC have issued guidelines strongly recommending that all persons, vaccinated or unvaccinated, wear masks in all indoor public spaces.

We will follow this new guidance. **Beginning now, it is strongly recommended that all persons entering Archdiocesan facilities be masked regardless of their vaccination status.** This applies to parish offices, schools, churches and other public spaces. Observance of this policy aligns us with public health officials layered mitigation strategies. Further guidance on mask usage during liturgies will be forthcoming for clergy and lay ministers. We will release student and staff mask guidelines for the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year shortly.

Online Mass

With less demand for online mass in our parish, we decided that next weekend will be our last regular 10:30am live YouTube mass. Going forward from that Sunday, only special celebrations, such as the Feast of St. Mother Teresa, will also be live on YouTube. We will keep you informed.

MIRACLES STILL HAPPEN - Fr. John Cuff

Everyone knows that Year B Gospel readings are taken from St. Mark. But beginning two weeks ago, and over five Sundays, the Gospel readings are taken from the sixth chapter of St. John, the longest in the Gospels. Why the exception? Because beginning with the miracle of the feeding of the 5000 in the desert, the theme of the sixth chapter is all about the Eucharist which Christ would give, the holiest and most important Sacrament of all, which makes Christ truly present in a world that deeply needs His presence. But in our modern secular world, are we Catholics truly aware of the Divine Presence?

Here's an incident that occurred a few years ago as related by the well-known "healing nun," Sister Briege McKenna, author of "Miracles Do Happen." She and her sidekick, Fr. Michael Scanlon, were just coming to the end of a healing week-end retreat that they were preaching to several dozen residents of a Home for the Elderly. At the closing Mass, as Father was giving Communion for the final time, he noticed that his ciborium was running dangerously low on hosts. Fortunately, as the last of the communicants lined up to receive, he was relieved to find he had just enough hosts so he wouldn't have to break any. But as soon as he distributed the last host, something at the rear of the chapel caught his eye which alarmed him. To his horror, he saw that a severely crippled woman in the back row had laboriously pulled herself up from her pew and was emerging into the aisle on crutches. Once in the aisle, she righted herself on her crutches, faced the altar, and ever so slowly began making her way toward him to receive Communion.

Father looked down at the ciborium—nothing. The woman continued to inch her way forward to the front of the chapel with great difficulty, one painful step at a time. It was obvious she was in great pain for her grunts could be heard by others. As she continued to struggle toward him, Father again looked down into the empty ciborium forlornly. What to do? He had already consumed the sacred wine. As he tried to think of what he was going to say, he looked down one final time and there in the ciborium was a sacred host. It was not there before. Much relieved, he gave her the host and returned to the altar amazed at what he had witnessed. He told Sr. Briege after Mass. Father Michael and Sister Briege have no doubt that they were present at a true miracle of the Eucharist to add to the many miracles that they have experienced in their ministry, and one of those which Christ occasionally works to show his people that He is truly the Living Bread come down from heaven.
