



Our Walk-A-Thon fundraiser generated a net profit of \$16,800.00.



LEPERS IN THE 21ST CENTURY

Today's Gospel story offers us a powerful story of the healing of the lepers. On his journey to Jerusalem, Jesus met ten lepers and healed them all. Only one of them realized that he was healed and came back and thanked Jesus for it. Leprosy was a serious infectious disease. Lepers had to be isolated from their families and communities and they were considered outcasts.

This disease continues to burden many in our time but, more than physical leprosy, St. Mother Teresa beautifully identified and described today's lepers as follows:

The greatest disease in the West today is not leprosy or TB. It's being unwanted, unloved, uncared for. We can cure physical diseases with medicine, but the only cure for loneliness, despair, and hopelessness is love. There are so many in the world who are dying for a piece of bread, but there are many more who are dying for a little love. The poverty in the West is a different kind of poverty than what I know in India. It's not only a poverty of loneliness, it's a poverty of spirituality. There's a hunger for love. There's a hunger for God.

Our spiritual loneliness makes us poor and, in many ways, isolated from one another and our God. People don't feel connected to their inner self, to others and to God. There is so much fear, mistrust, and violence in our culture. We need God's healing power and we need to be God's healing instrument. St. Mother Teresa says that the best healing medicine is love. She shares the following true story which I believe can be inspirational and thought-provoking for us:

The sisters care for forty-nine thousand lepers. They are among the most unwanted, unloved, and neglected people. The other day one of our sisters was washing a leper covered with sores. A Muslim holy man was present, standing close to her. He said, "All these years I have believed that Jesus Christ is a prophet. Today I believe that Jesus Christ is God since he has been able to give such joy to this sister, so that she can do her work with so much love."

Indeed they know we are Christians by our love. October is a month when we are called to pray and reflect on our mission: a mission which comes from Jesus Christ, a mission to heal and a mission to love. This mission is rooted in our faith, nourished by prayers and lived out by service and good action!

BELIEVING AND THANKING By Sister Caritas

Many years ago, my mother was in the hospital with a ruptured intestine and peritonitis. At that time, not too many people recovered from that serious infection. I went to the hospital, spoke with the doctor and he told me my mother should be anointed since she was dying. I asked her if she wanted to be anointed. To her that meant she was dying. I said I would go and get the priest on my way home. She agreed and I went to our parish, not too far from the hospital, and Father went and anointed her. I prayed very hard. I begged that, like the lepers, she would get well. She was healed. She continued to live many years until she died at 76. I was deeply grateful. She was the parent I had left as my father had died when I was 9. I had a stepfather.

In today's Gospel and in the first reading, we hear stories about lepers. These are people with a serious disease which destroys parts of our bodies, like fingers, toes, nose, and ears for starters. Then the disease continues to destroy tissue and bone. Today this disease exists but is recognized and cured. It is still very contagious. People with this disease lived in the desert or away from their families because of the contagiousness. They came to Jesus in the Gospel, and He cured them. They were cured as they were on their way. One person was grateful and went back to Jesus and thanked Him. He said, "Where are the other nine?" Jesus recognized the one who came back grateful. However, the others were still cured. Their ingratitude did not take away the healing physically.

Many times in our lives, we are faced with things which seem impossible. How will things change? How will things become better? How will this person or we, ourselves, be healed? Prayer and faith make all things possible with God. Faith is not just saying the words. Faith is a deep, convicted choice to believe it can happen, without doubt or hesitation. It is believing that God can make it happen and that God will make it happen. What about things you are concerned about now? What about you believing, asking, and praying to God? Do you go back and say thank you? Gratitude is a very important characteristic. Jesus treasures our gratitude. Will you trust? Will you believe? Can you be grateful? Praise God in this way. Grow in this way.

Are you preparing for surgery or recovering from the effects of surgery? Come and receive this sacrament. Let Jesus heal you.
