

TRUE KING, CHRIST, THE KING By Sister Caritas

One of the visible and influential monarchs which we in the United States are aware of is the Queen of England, Queen Elizabeth. The Queen of England has been in power in for many years. She lives in Buckingham Palace and has military at her disposal. She and her family have elements in their lives which indicate power and wealth. As democracy continues to grow throughout the world, monarchy and its power changes but still exists.

Today we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. The scriptural passage read as the Gospel today presents the dialogue between the "good thief", the other thief, and Jesus at Calvary on the crosses. The good thief says, "Remember me when you come into your kingdom", and Jesus replies, "This day you will be with me in paradise." Jesus acts, even at the point of His death, with compassion and care. Jesus is on the cross, not in a palace or throne. Jesus has no military at His disposal. One disciple, His Mother, Mary Magdalen, and a few women, are at the foot of His cross. The "trappings" of modern day kings and queens does not exist to support the Kingship of Jesus. The Church has provided us with this Feast today to remind us of Jesus being the true king of the world. His power is not military might but, rather, care, love, forgiveness, and redemption. He comes as one of us, teaches and lives a life to be followed as a way to the Father. He, unlike some kings and queens, lays down His life by His own choice for us, whom He loves. He gives us the pattern and the right to the kingdom of heaven.

St Paul gave us a detailed description of who Jesus is; "Image of the invisible God, all things were created through Him, through Him all things are reconciled to God by the blood of the cross." Many other things are written in St. Paul, too. We know Jesus provided the possibility of salvation making it available to us. The real question is will you and I open ourselves to choosing to reach out for reconciliation, choosing to follow Jesus, to accept the gift of grace and salvation? Jesus brings these gifts of grace to us through His death and resurrection. As we begin Advent, what are you willing to do to open yourself to the full coming of Jesus into your everyday life? Will you embrace the gift of redemption and salvation? It is each one's choice. "Now is the acceptable time. Now is the day of salvation."

THE IMPORTANCE OF LITURGY AND OF THE MINISTRY OF LITURGY COMMITTEE

“The liturgy, especially the Mass, must be the center of a parish’s community life and the moment, which allows the faith community to come together, to be ‘one in heart and soul.’ Liturgy should bond us together because at the center of our liturgical experience is Christ.” Fr. Brad Zamora emphasized this truth with our ministers last Saturday. Through his inspiring talk titled, “Encountering Christ through the Liturgy,” Fr. Brad reminded all of our ministers the importance of having joy in our service in the liturgy through which we encounter Christ in a real and transforming way. The fact of the matter is that this encounter is for all who participate in the liturgy. Fr. Brad puts this beautifully as follows:

Indeed, there should be an encounter with Christ for each and every person who gathers for liturgy. This can occur in many different ways and each of us, I bet, could speak to how we have encountered Christ at liturgy. It could be the way in which the presider’s “ars celebrandi”, or his art of celebrating the liturgy, draws you into the sacred mysteries. It could be the way I n which the lector proclaims the Word and the way in which the Extraordinary Minister of

Holy Communion raises the host before you that it is obvious they have a personal relationship with Christ who is at the center of their proclamation and their distribution. It could be the way in which a minister of hospitality and an usher welcome those attending liturgy, for all who gather in this place are surely welcome and should be treated as honored guests in God's house. It could be the way in which the music soars and lifts the soul and creates a foretaste of the Heavenly Kingdom. There are so many ways for one to encounter Christ at liturgy, and one is not better than the other...the reality is that encounter is the center of the liturgy.

In encountering Jesus, we are changed and transformed. The experience of being changed compels each of us to witness God's love in our everyday lives. Again using the words of Fr. Brad,

It's up to us, as people who have encountered Christ, and are continually encountering Christ, to be witnesses to Him. It's by using our worship as a vehicle for encounter, and living authentic lives of discipleship, that we will form hearts and build community. Then, my friends, with every celebration of the Eucharist you will more deeply reverence the real presence of Christ in the sacrament we receive—and become, more and more, aware of the presence of Christ in this community. Realize that every moment of prayer is an opportunity to grow closer to the Lord and each other. Realize that the liturgy isn't just a me and Jesus moment, but a communal one, a true moment of communion and that we are drawn closer and closer to the mystery we receive, the mystery we are, and the mystery that makes us members of the Body of Christ. And that at the center of the liturgy, which is the center of parish life, is the opportunity for an encounter with Christ. Let's be this kind of Church! Amen!

In order for the liturgy to be well planned and celebrated, parishes have a Liturgy Committee to take on this responsibility. Kathy Lindell writes,

Liturgy committees exist principally to enhance the living experience of the people of God as they come together in yearning to sustain the vision of a kingdom come in Jesus Christ.

The revised *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (*G.I.R.M.*) notes the importance of directions about the preparation of people's hearts and minds, and of the places, rites, and texts for the celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist (No. 1). It clearly acknowledges that since liturgy is the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian Spirit...the entire celebration is planned in such a way that it leads to a conscious, active and full participation of the faithful both in body and mind (No. 17).
