




Our Community Room was packed and they had a lot of fun praying together, sharing food, playing games and interacting with one another.



AWAKENING TO THE PRESENCE OF THE LORD ALWAYS



I joined our St. Rocco members after their annual memorial mass last Sunday for a wonderful reception at Connie's Pizza, and I was surprised to see that the restaurant is already beautifully decorated for Christmas with all enjoyable and delightful lights. What a reminder on what's coming up for us! Also, with the celebration of Thanksgiving and the craziness of Black Friday, people have already begun to prepare for Christmas.

This weekend, our Church starts a new liturgical year—the Advent Season. It calls us to not get ahead of ourselves, but spend the next four weeks to prepare ourselves. Advent calls us to “stay awake.” Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI wrote beautifully:

Advent, this powerful liturgical season that we are beginning, invites us to pause in silence to understand a presence. It is an invitation to understand that the individual events of the day are hints that God is giving us, signs of the attention he has for each one of us.

This is the time to prepare ourselves spiritually for the coming celebration of the mystery and the wonders of God's incarnation, “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.”

Advent literally is one of the busiest times of the year when we have to buy gifts, decorate our houses, and host and attend many parties in the spirit of the season. With all the hustle and bustle of the secular Christmas season, it's easy for us to be pre-occupied with all these things. In the midst of all this, the Church calls us to be awakened to the presence of the Lord among us and in our World. The question is, “How are we going to prepare ourselves for Christmas?” I would like to suggest the following spiritual exercises for your consideration:

1. **Prayer:** Make a few minutes to pray every day. If it's possible, pray together as a family. Make attending mass a priority and consider inviting a neighbor, a family member or a friend to join you for Mass.
2. **Adoration:** Spend time with Jesus in the Eucharist through silent adoration and strive to receive Jesus as though he is coming to you for the first time.
3. **Service:** Do something good for the needy and the poor. Charity is an expression of our faith in action.
4. **Scripture:** Read a passage every day as a source of your spiritual nourishment.
5. **Witness:** Actions speak louder than words, so express your faith whenever you can.
6. **Reconciliation:** Take time to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a powerful opportunity of experiencing God's forgiveness and grace.

You may already be doing the above mentioned corporal and spiritual works of mercy, which are wonderful. Or you may have your personal forms and styles of prayers. Whatever the case might be, Advent calls us all to re-examine our lives and renew our relationships with God and others. Let's make the effort to allow God to work wonders in our lives.

LET US PREPARE by Sr. Caritas

A few days ago, before Thanksgiving, many people were very involved in preparation. Food had to be purchased and cooked, homes had to be cleaned to prepare for family to attend the dinner. Invitations were sent and many other things had to be done to prepare our families and homes for the feast of Thanksgiving. Hopefully we also prepared our spirit by giving thanks to God for our many blessings.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us to stay awake, be ready, PREPARE. He reminds us that we are to prepare for the coming of the Son of Man who will come at the end of time to take us up the "highest mountain to the house of God." We must be prepared now, every moment, for "at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." WE are called to pay attention.

We begin this sacred Season of Advent today. How are we to prepare? What are we to do? Will you recognize The Son of Man when He comes? If we pray, if we listen to the voice of God speaking to us in the Gospel in our everyday lives, we will start to be ready. This is the season of preparation. We become very busy. We are concerned with gifts for family and friends, presents and parties and celebrations. In the midst of all this, the words of Jesus need to be considered. Time needs to be taken. A time prepared for reflection, focused attention to God. We need to pay attention each day, in the tiny periods of silence in our lives, that Jesus is coming and at the same time is already with us. Pay Attention, Listen. We do not know the day or the hour.

Faith Formation for Children, ages 3-7, on Saturdays at 9:30 am at the St. Therese Worship Site: The Sisters of Charity are offering the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program for children between the ages of 3 to 7 in our community room on Saturdays from 9:30 - 11:00 am. Storytelling, interactive games, art projects, and hands-on activities will highlight the dynamic, faith-filled program. Parents are welcome to accompany their children or simply drop them off and return. The program will run through May, 2020. You can still enroll your children in these classes. Please call either of our parish offices to register.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the sick will take place at the St. Therese Worship Site today, December 1st at the 8:00 am and 10:00 am Masses.

St. Barbara Feast Day: The St. Barbara Feast Day is this Wednesday, December 4th. There will be a special Mass at the St. Barbara Worship Site at 7:00 pm.

Baby Bottle Project: St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta Parish (both worship sites) will participate in the Baby Bottle Project for Advent. Bottles will be distributed this weekend. Please take a bottle from the students, fill it, and return it to church by the weekend of December 21-22.

Advent Retreat: There will be an Advent Retreat in the St. Barbara Parish Center on Saturday, December 7th, from 9:30 am to 3:30 pm. Leading the retreat will be Rev. Thomas P. Henehan, MM, who will be speaking on the topic of "Awakening to a New Meaning of the Mystery of the Incarnation, the Birth of Jesus. The donation to attend the retreat is \$10.00 to cover the cost of lunch.

Parent Association Breakfast with Santa: Following the 9:30 am Mass at St. Barbara on Sunday, December 8th, there will be a Breakfast with Santa. Tickets will not be sold at the door. (Please see enclosed flyer for prices.) They need to be purchased by Wednesday, November 27th. Everyone is welcome. If you are interested in joining us for the breakfast and do not have children in school, please call the rectory (312-842-7979) with your order for tickets.

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception: Because this year the Feast of the Immaculate Conception falls on a Sunday, the feast will be celebrated on Monday, December 9th. There will be a 7:00 pm Mass on that Monday at the St. Barbara Worship Site. The Immaculate Conception is not considered a Holy Day of Obligation this year.

Simbang Gabi Mass: The annual Simbang Gabi Mass will be celebrated at the St. Barbara Worship Site on Saturday, December 14th at the 5:00 pm Mass. Hospitality will be held in the Lower Hall following that Mass.

Advent Reconciliation: Advent Reconciliation at the St. Barbara Worship Site will be held on Monday, December 16th at 7:00 pm.

St. Therese All-School Christmas Concert: The annual school Christmas concert will take place on Wednesday, December 18th at 6:00 pm.

English as a Second Language: If you know someone who needs instruction in English conversation, Sr. Caritas may be available to help (depending on the time). 
