From the Desk of Fr. Francis

Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.



Honoring and Celebrating Saint Barbara

As the season of Advent continues to unfold, in this busiest time of the year, we make special efforts to renew our spirit by becoming more aware of our past, living well our present and having firm hope for our future. This week is particularly important to our community as we also honor the patroness of our Church, St. Barbara. She was a virgin and a martyr, whose feast day is on Dec. 4th. As I have asked for her intercessions for our community and our Church, I was once again impressed by the history of our Church, which is named after this powerful Saint and is beautifully narrated by Walter J. Podrazik and Grace DuMelle. Both are longtime faithful parishioners. I took the following excerpt from their writings which I think will help us as honor and celebrate our Church's patron.

St. Barbara parish began more than a century ago, as great steamship lines were docking at Ellis Island, unloading wave after wave of Polish immigrants. At the beginning of the twentieth century, these new arrivals were looking for a better way of life, looking for freedom from Russian army conscription and from restrictions on their language and religion. Thousands headed for Chicago and Bridgeport, where the mills, factories and packing houses provided plenty of employment.

The nearest Polish parish, St. Mary of Perpetual Help, bulged at the seams. Pastor Rev. Stanislaus Nawrocki obtained approval to buy land for a new parish along Throop Street. In 1910, his younger brother, Rev. Anthony Nawrocki, became the first pastor of the new St. Barbara parish.

His first priorities were an elementary school, convent, and rectory. Mass and the sacraments were celebrated in the basement hall of the school while construction went forward on the church.

The domed, Renaissance-style church took two years and \$175,000 to build. No pillars were used in the interior so sight-lines would be clear for the 1,200 worshippers that could be accommodated. A solemn dedication and consecration took place July 5, 1914.

An \$82,000 school addition was completed in 1924, adding an auditorium, six-lane bowling alley, billiard room, and kitchen. Six new classrooms also accommodated a two-year commercial high school, which upgraded to a four-year institution in 1947, changing its admission policy to young women only.

St. Barbara successfully marked its centennial in 2010 as a time of spiritual and physical renewal. That included the painting and restoration of the interior of the church by the Oosterbaan & Sons Company in 2012, which revitalized and showcased the artistic treasure that is St. Barbara. It is a stunning home to a dedicated Catholic community whose heritage encompasses Europe, Asia, Africa, and Latin America. The welcoming spirit of St. Barbara continues today to all who step through the church door, into the school classrooms, or enter any parish event. We invite you to visit St. Barbara and to experience for yourself the joy, excitement, and spiritual renewal of this place.





The Voice of Preparation by Sister Caritas

Do you remember being told that your birthday was coming when you were very young? Because very young children have no real understanding of time, maybe you woke up the next day and asked if it was your birthday even though it was really several weeks or months away. Then began the wait. The days, even if they were a few, seemed like forever and the anticipation grew as time passed until it was your birthday. What joy when you were told this was the day.

From the time of the promise of God to the first humans, that they would receive redemption through the Messiah, a savior, until the time when Jesus came, the Jewish people waited for the fulfillment of the promise. They looked for the signs that Isaiah told. Sometimes they thought the years, the time of the coming was near. Other times I'm sure they wondered if the promised Messiah would ever come. God is always faithful to His promises.

Our first reading today describes the peace and justice that the Messiah would bring and exist in His Kingdom. All the needed virtues of knowledge, understanding counsel, strength, wisdom and justice, would be found in the Messiah. The Messiah was to be born of a virgin. The kingdom when established, would have all natural enemies at peace with each other. Even the poor and afflicted, the outcast and the hopeless would find justice and fair judgement. God's kingdom, His holy mountain, would be free from harm or ruin. The earth would be filled "with the knowledge of the Lord." John the Baptist tells us he is the one who is to prepare for THE Messiah. The kingdom of God is at hand.

If John came personally to you, explained what could be and what was to come and told you to repent, would you? So he is speaking today. John cries out, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His path." This is the goal of this week of Advent. Will you respond?
